CDRC Report Feb '17 Sue Edwards.

Health & Community Development Manager

Prestatyn & Meliden External Defib project.

This project is near completion. The four new external defibrillators have now been sited.

1. Ty Pendre Building
2. Retail Park – Boots
3. Meliden CC – Surgery wall
4. Gronant.

The First responders have delivered training sessions at venues close to the defibs. The sessions are run to show how easy they are to use and give people more confidence to do so.

The last stage is a signage project to direct people to the nearest available de fib unit.

The new units will also be put on the town map at the next revision.

Dementia Projects.

Prestatyn has gained the status of 'working towards becoming a dementia friendly town'.

The steps taken so far include:

Delivering information sessions to enable people to become 'dementia friends'. This includes the local shops and service providers.

Training up Dementia friends to become Dementia Champions who can then deliver sessions themselves.

Having dementia friendly activities enabling people with dementia to take part in community activities.

And most recently, setting up of Dementia drop in sessions to be held weekly on Friday afternoons.

These sessions will enable attendees to have access to information and to meet others in the same situation.

We are also aiming to combat the isolation felt by citizens through:

- Providing a relaxing place where people can share experiences.
- Providing a range of speakers and activities that give information that helps to support members.
- Enabling both carers and cared-for to share and enjoy an activity together
- Speaking out about dementia and its effects so that people feel empowered to deal with it.
- Developing a range of resources and information that people can use to help improve their knowledge of the condition and to enhance their daily lives.
- Most importantly for people to have fun together.

Dementia friendly Prestatyn have their own 'face book' page and a Prestatyn Friendly web page thanks to Peter Harrison Artisans CIC.

Mind Music continues to thrive with over 20 participants each week. The lottery funding finishes at the end of March. For 2017/18 Prestatyn Dementia Friendly Community are putting up half the funding and I am expecting to hear shortly if the ICF (Intermediate Care Fund) are willing to put up the rest. I have also put out some feelers for funding for 2018/19 which is looking promising.

I have arranged a trip for the group to see 'Calamity Jane' at Theatre Colwyn, a dementia friendly Sing-a -long production in March.

We now have a till in the office which is making the booking/deposit system a lot simpler.

Local Foodbank situation.

The Alive Church (ex Calvary) who run the local foodbank are now members of the Trussel Trust. I thought that this being the case, any food collected locally e.g. Tesco's (Trussel Trust) collection, would go to a local supplier. However this is not the case and the food collected by Tesco is still going to a food bank in Denbigh. I have spoken to the Alive Church group and they are not happy with this arrangement and have arranged a meeting with the trust. For now, the only drop off points for the foodbank are at The Artisans CIC the old library and the Alive church itself.

I am awaiting the new branding and will be running a promotion for the local drop off points and if things don't change with Tesco, we will be aiming to organise more collection points. Please promote the local drop offs to your constituents.

FUTURE PLANS

We are working on funding with Healthy Prestatyn lach on funding for healthy living projects.

SCHOOLS

I am also interested in the golden mile project and would like to work with schools to initiate it. This involves going into schools and asking them to mark out a track around the school grounds and encouraging all children to walk/run 1 mile at some point during the day. They can then set themselves goals such as running a marathon in two weeks (13 laps in a week) with certificates of achievement etc.

I continue to support the Winners project, Cardiac rehab phase3 on secondment to the health board and the walking festival/programme.

Report March 2017

Prestatyn Social Riders

Alive Pentecostal Church continues support, allowing use of the room for regular maintenance/coffee meets and cycle courses.

Independent group constitution 'not for profit' with bank account since July. Peter Thomas and Derek Warren are the trustees. PTC given grant £200 to help group maintain the bikes.

Regular group maintenance sessions – next one planned for March 20th 9am prior to the ride.

Cycle Support Riders level 2 completed by DW and PT.

Level 2 Cycle Maintenance course Friday 17th February at Alive Church. DW and PT attended – improve knowledge/skills and accreditation awarded on completion. Necessary for insurance purposes.

PTC trailer used Wednesdays to ride other cycle routes. Checked regularly by the group annual serviced by Trailer hire Rhyl.

Annual bike week 10th – 18th June 2017. Annual celebration ride on Monday 12th June. Route yet to be confirmed.

Aim-Once leaders received bike maintenance accreditation, PTC to officially transfer the bike ownership to the Prestatyn Social Riders.

Community Allotment at Coed y Morfa

Starting back on Tuesday 7th March 4.15-5.45pm. All welcome. Children to be accompanied by an adult.

Polytunnel beds now in place. The large middle bed will be used by the Community allotment and the long bed at the back will be allocated to the Tenants. DCC have requested DH to oversee this.

DH to oversee the Community Allotment. Making enquiries into horticultural support from other areas. (DVSC also contacted). DCC warden working on site from March- 2 hours per week for maintenance.

Cubs back working on their plots. PTC funding 2 plots until September. Cubs may have funds to continue after this date.

Prestatyn Flower show judging on site in June. Community allotment, Cubs, Brownies and all schools taking part.

Visit to Botanical Garden Enterprises arranged 28th Feb with the group.

DH running Green fingers session on HLAP Feb half term. Grow a pizza!

Following on from the success of the new international youth film Festival Cidwm Cymru/Wicked Wales in 2016, we are now planning to hold another Festival between October 10th –14th 2017 with the opening in Prestatyn. We were grateful for the high profile presence and support from the Mayor last year promoting Prestatyn to our international guests, we were also pleased with the response we had from local schools and businesses.

Regular meetings are now taking place with the local schools in Prestatyn and Meliden to build on the work of last year.

The workshops and screenings were valued last year by schools and the feedback was all very positive. The feedback identified the need for more specialised media workshops and more information as to how young people can enter the digital creative industries. This is an important industry with identified skills shortages in Wales. Currently jobs in the creative industries make up 9% of the workforce in the UK and is one of the 9 economic priority sectors for Welsh Government.

Last year the Festival used local services and businesses spending over £20,000.00 directly into the local economy and invited 40+ guests for 5 days who all shopped in the High street during their visit.

We have listened to the schools and have agreed to hold an industry training day linking with many aspects of the digital industry. We have had initial discussions with a number of organisations who are happy to support the activity including Pinewood Studios, Welsh government (the commercial part of the film and television industry in Wales), Ffilm Cymru Wales responsible for the subsidised Film industry and film education in Wales, Film Hub Wales part of the British Film Institute BFI, Into Film BFI education providers and Bafta Cymru as our Festival has recently become a Bafta supported Festival. We will also offer workshops to the schools during the day to help develop new digital skills.

We have included an element of management and admin fees in the application as the majority of the work is delivered with the goodwill of volunteers.
