Activities Report November 19

Monday

- **Social Bowling** – 10-11am weekly at the North Wales Bowls Centre. 20+ attending. Objective achieved. DH refers clients from Exercise Referral scheme to the session. 8 referred this year.
- **NEW Beginners confidence Cycle session**- Mondays 10-11am at Alive Church. Advertised on let's ride website with Derek Warren British cycling leader and DH. 7 attending bikes used from container. DW checks and maintains bikes and all ride under the guidelines/rules of British Cycling.

Peter Thomas (Prestatyn Social Riders) ceased advertising on website as wanting more flexibility to do own rides (5 in the group). Peter has been a huge support over the passed 8 years to promoting cycling and organising the 3 weekly social rides.
- **Easy Paced Walk** 1.45pm 35-45 mins YNWA – supports the exercise referral, good numbers attending. One new walk leader Catrin Clucas trained in October and supports the Monday walk with DH.
- **NEW Easy beginners Golf** – May- September. 6 attended. 4 taken up the introduction membership at end of September. Session will start again in May 2020.

Tuesday

- **Prestatyn Walking Football Club (PWF)** – Tuesdays PLC 5-6pm / PTFC Thursdays 12-2pm. Club well organised now over 22 signed up members. 2 members now completed level 1 coaching and 2 trained as first aiders. Awaiting first North Wales Referee course at Deeside soon. Bob Williams secured sponsorship and John Dean (club member) designed club logo now printed on all kit. The club fundraising for a defibrillator at PTFC. Walking football on Prestatyn exercise referral timetable. Objective achieved ahead of schedule.
- **Walking Football festival 22/9** – DH with DCC at St Asaph Leisure Centre. 8 teams from across North Wales entered raising funds for Prostate Cancer UK.
- **Community Allotment** Tuesday 3-4.30pm March-October – Plants/flowers sold every Tuesday for small donations and flowers seeds collected from dead flowers and offered free. Wild flower area planted on 5/11 with money donated and 2 storage boxes for horticultural books. 8 Green planters at entrance now managed by named tenant for a floral display for next season. First meeting of year held 1/10 with good attendance, DH and Claudia DCC. Agreed need for more regular meetings and new WhatsApp group set up. Barry Riddiford now supporting Simon Roberts as joint Chairman.

- **NEW 'Age Cymru' Low Impact Exercise class– Tuesday 12-1pm at Kings Hall – Free class** delivered by Jason Pritchard Age Cymru volunteer. DH supports at arms length as class successful with approximately 20 attending regularly. Objective achieved.
- **Cycling in Schools** – New date offered to schools 14/2/20. Tim Matthews from Welsh Cycling will run the course (£50 per person). PTC to fund 6 places in a local school. This is not cycle proficiency which teaches older primary children (Y 5-6) to cycle safely on roads. This is for teachers/volunteers to be given training to deliver a fun cycling session in the playground for all age children. DH to liaise with schools and TM /DH to support schools who take up the training.
- HLAP – DH supports cycling, golf and men's sheds activities.

7 Activities provided altogether which included 2 for the SEN group.

Registration forms updated to include statement about parents collecting children on time and to stress the importance of always being available on the emergency contact number available.

Also the GDPR statement re confidentiality of details provided for activity providers is now to go out with the registers for each session as different people take the same sessions if working for a company rather than sole instructor.

Dementia Initiative

New project - Music to you

I have now got enough volunteers to take some singing sessions into residential and nursing homes. We have our pilot session booked for 21st November at Priory House.

I am also offering Dementia Friends information sessions to groups.

Mind Music has been a challenge with our leader being off sick but we continue to gain new members – 5 this month.

We had a free taster session from The Forget-me-Not Choir who are a south Wales based charity launching in Llandudno, who offer formal choir sessions to those with dementia.

We had two items donated to sell to raise money for Mind Music. A ladies bike which raised £45. Thanks go to Mr. & Mrs. Tom Baxter. Also an adult sized drum kit currently on offer at around £100. Any Offers?

Morfa's Project Social Inclusion See attached notes for reasoning.

I have been putting a bid together for a grant to enable us to erect a building – probably log cabin style near to the allotment site. Since starting this it has transpired that there is money to do this from DCC commuted sums. I am also doing research into how we can do this as environmentally friendly as possible. Environmentally Friendly Prestatyn (ex PDEA) are working with us on this.

I continue to support the weekly Cardiac Rehab session and the Winners Exercise referral programme at the Nova.

Morfa Social Inclusion project

Short Project Description

Acquiring and building of Log Cabin with toilet and kitchen facilities on allotment site next to The Morfa's common ground to improve conditions for, and encourage community groups using the allotments and surrounding out door space. To improve Mental Health and integration, reducing social isolation.

Project description

To facilitate more outdoor activities, allowing people to access group activities and make new friends and aid retention of members of current community groups. Also allow a meeting place with facilities for environmental education courses and Wellness courses.

Prestatyn Business Breakfast	
The Business Breakfast is an opportunity to engage with businesses, and tell them about the support, projects and opportunities being brought to Prestatyn. The Business Breakfast also offers a chance for consultation regarding needs and wants for the future, and networking. Feedback from the consultations that have taken place has been positive. Raising my profile, receiving enquiries and providing follow up information for businesses. The Business Breakfast are now sustainable as I have secured sponsorship from Federation of Small Businesses. Businesses will have the opportunity to book appointments for the Business Point at Business Breakfasts.

Prestatyn Business Point

Development of a Prestatyn Business Point PTC Initiative - Collaborative approach to business support, offering a one stop shop for business. Prestatyn Business Hub now includes representatives from Business Wales, Job Centre Plus Business Engagement, Federation of Small Businesses & Welsh in Business.

I am the triage for enquires, offering support and signposting when needed. I have received some enquiries so far and these have been resolved. Once works on PTC have been completed, the Point will be held in the community room/ Chambers at PTC. The Business Point will be held regularly and will both be on an appointment and drop-in basis.

- Separately liaised with Business Wales & DWP regarding Business enquiries and Prestatyn retail vacancies.
- Met with Paul Murphey DWP to discuss having a regular presence within the office to support retail recruitment.
- 22.10.19 met with Nia Morris Welsh in Business to discuss what services they provide and resources available, Nia would also like to be involved in the Business Point.

Regularly visiting businesses to disseminate information and engage. Gathered information and completed actions in relation to enquiries, providing businesses with updates where necessary.

Ongoing - Continue to triage enquiries, offering support and signposting.

- Maintain communications with Business Wales and Job Centre Plus.
- Regularly visit businesses, discussing need, wants and promoting PTC activities.

Future work streams;

- Create information pack for attendees of the Business Point.
- Organised a programme of courses with Business Wales on various topics for new and existing Businesses.

Information has been gathered on the latest changes, I organised to have an editable map of the High Street. I now have the revised map and have been inputting the new information. Currently updating and collating contact details for all businesses to create a comprehensive mailing list adhering to GDPR. The mailing list will be utilised to invite businesses to the Business Breakfasts and Business Point, and circulate relevant information regarding support and activities. In the process of developing welcome pack for new Businesses. As requested, a separate list of shops that have moved or closed on the high street has been created, including the reason. The majority of change has been due to expansion. Ongoing; Continue to update directory. Expand mailing list for Businesses. Future work streams; • Circulate welcome packs to new business.
4. Develop a bank of volunteers	Volunteer Event 28th April 2020 provisionally booked Business Wales, DWP. Plastic Free Communities has been created by SAS and is the only step-by-step community framework, uniting individuals, schools, businesses, community groups and local government to drive action on reducing local use of avoidable single-use plastics.

- The evidence has been submitted to SAS, the steering group has received a list of additional information to obtain. I have worked with the steering group to complete this.

Events 2019

Easter

The Easter Eggstravaganza was held on the Saturday of Easter weekend and was focussed around the town centre. Activities including an egg drop; chocolate fountain; egg hunt; biscuit decorating; magic shows; Easter Bonnet decorating competition and decorated egg competition; play bus; routemaster bus; characters; live music; face painting, were spread out throughout the High Street and were free.

The event was very well attended with hundreds of families attending and we received excellent feedback.

Summer - Open Air Theatre

In August we had a professional theatre company choose Prestatyn as a venue for their summer tour.

We organised the use of Coronation Gardens, booked facilities i.e toilets, security and electric supply and supported the marketing and ticket sales for the show. The surrounding businesses were contacted to allow them to prepare for a potential increase in footfall.

We also ensured the neighbouring properties were all offered complimentary tickets for the show to limit disruption for them.

The event was a resounding success with over 100 tickets being sold and excellent feedback from the evening. The company reported that it was the best audience they have had at a new venue and said the reception they received means they are keen to make Prestatyn a regular venue for their annual tour.

The provisional date for next year's production is Thursday 30th July 2020.

Routemaster Bus

This summer the Routemaster Bus returned and was extremely popular.

In the lead up to the summer holidays, the office received a high volume of calls asking whether the bus will be back which is encouraging and confirms the popularity for this attraction.

This year, the bus ran every Thursday for the six weeks of the summer holidays. The bus operator estimated user figures around 300- 350 users per day.

Eisteddfod

The Eisteddfod team approached Prestatyn Town Council for some support during the planning stages of the Urdd Proclamation Ceremony. Support including sourcing and booking the Dragon puppet,

Welsh Flags, decorating the High Street with bunting, banners and flags, providing parking facilities, and organising the Routemaster bus for transporting people from the parking to the High School.

Halloween

The Halloween Spooktacular was held on Thursday 31st October, spanning the length of the High Street, Nant Hall Road and King's Avenue. Activities included art & craft; stilt walker; Disney villain characters; face painting; temporary & glitter tattoos; inflatable party dome; spooky bus; creepy crawlies; witch hunt and trick or treating.

The activities were spread out throughout the town centre to ensure circulation of attendees. The shops were asked to supply their own sweets for the trick or treating.

This year was the first year that we had shops calling up in advance to ensure they were included as part of the event which is a sign of the success of previous events.

We had over 450 witch hunt sheets given out during the 4 hours of events which were only given to the children who wished to take part. This would imply that the actual attendance for the event was well over 1000 people.

The feedback on social media was very good and there was a good write up in the Rhyl Journal following the event. Businesses have also confirmed they felt the event was very successful.

Remembrance Sunday Parade

Following the closure of the TA Centre, the Royal British Legion approached Prestatyn Town Council a couple of weeks ago to ask for support to organise the Remembrance Sunday Parade before the church service.

Initially there was difficulty sourcing a marching band, however after a social media campaign, former members of the 2193 Squadron Air Training Corps TA have managed to pull together a marching band; some of whom will be travelling from a fair distance to attend the event.

Christmas Light Switch on

As per last year, the Christmas Light switch on will take place outside David Jones Upholsterer in close proximity to the town's tree. The necessary agreements have been sought from Savills.

There will be a stage hired and the primary schools will attend and sing 5 songs in chorus.

The event will start at approx. 3.45pm with the lights being switched on just after 4.15pm.

The lights will be switched on by Cllr Tony Flynn as Mayor of Prestatyn and Meliden.

A Traditional Christmas in Prestatyn

This event has been built upon following last year. The plans currently include reindeer; Santa's grotto; arts and crafts; live music; characters; rides; and a Christmas Market. CYTUN will be providing a Living Nativity to be part of the event.

The Christmas Market will be spread between the various town centre church halls with the aim of creating a 'trail' through the High Street so that the businesses can be incorporated and to encourage people to circulate the High Street.

We will suggest that the businesses provide a special offer for the event which can be publicised to attendees. There will be a map produced to hand out to attendees.

As always, I am looking for anyone who is able to volunteer their time to assist with the event.

Title of Report **Installation of Bus Shelters (X2) Ceg-y-Ffordd**

Purpose of Report

To seek decision from CDRC Committee to install 2 bus shelters at Ceg-y-Ffordd, Ffordd Penrhwyfya, Prestatyn at a total cost of £10,000 of which Denbighshire CC will contribute 50%

Background

Requests for the installation of bus shelters have previously been received by the Public Transport section at DCC with the final request (copy attached) dated 30th September 2019. Buses do currently stop at both locations, however the predominantly elderly population who use the bus service are left waiting for the service in all inclement weather

Also attached are letters from residents in the near vicinity in support of the proposal

4 Financial Impact

Further to discussions with the Officer at DCC the total supply and install costs of 2 bus shelters in this location are £10,000 and DCC will pay 50% of those costs and arrange and oversee the installation

Prestatyn Town Council have provision in their budget in 2019/20 from the following streams

- £4,000 from Town Regeneration (Coastal and Other Projects)
- £1,000 from Town Regeneration Services (Bus Shelters)
