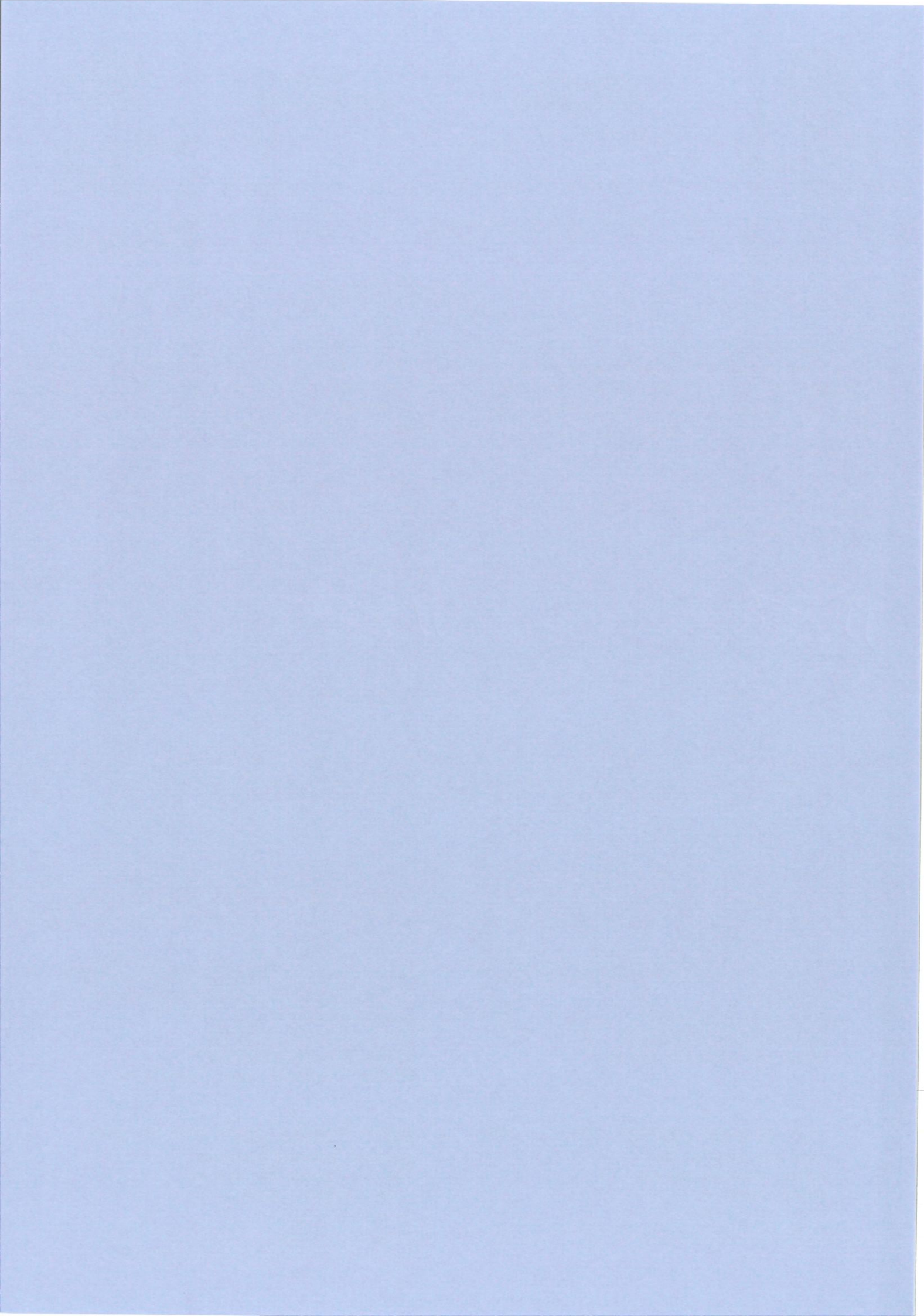

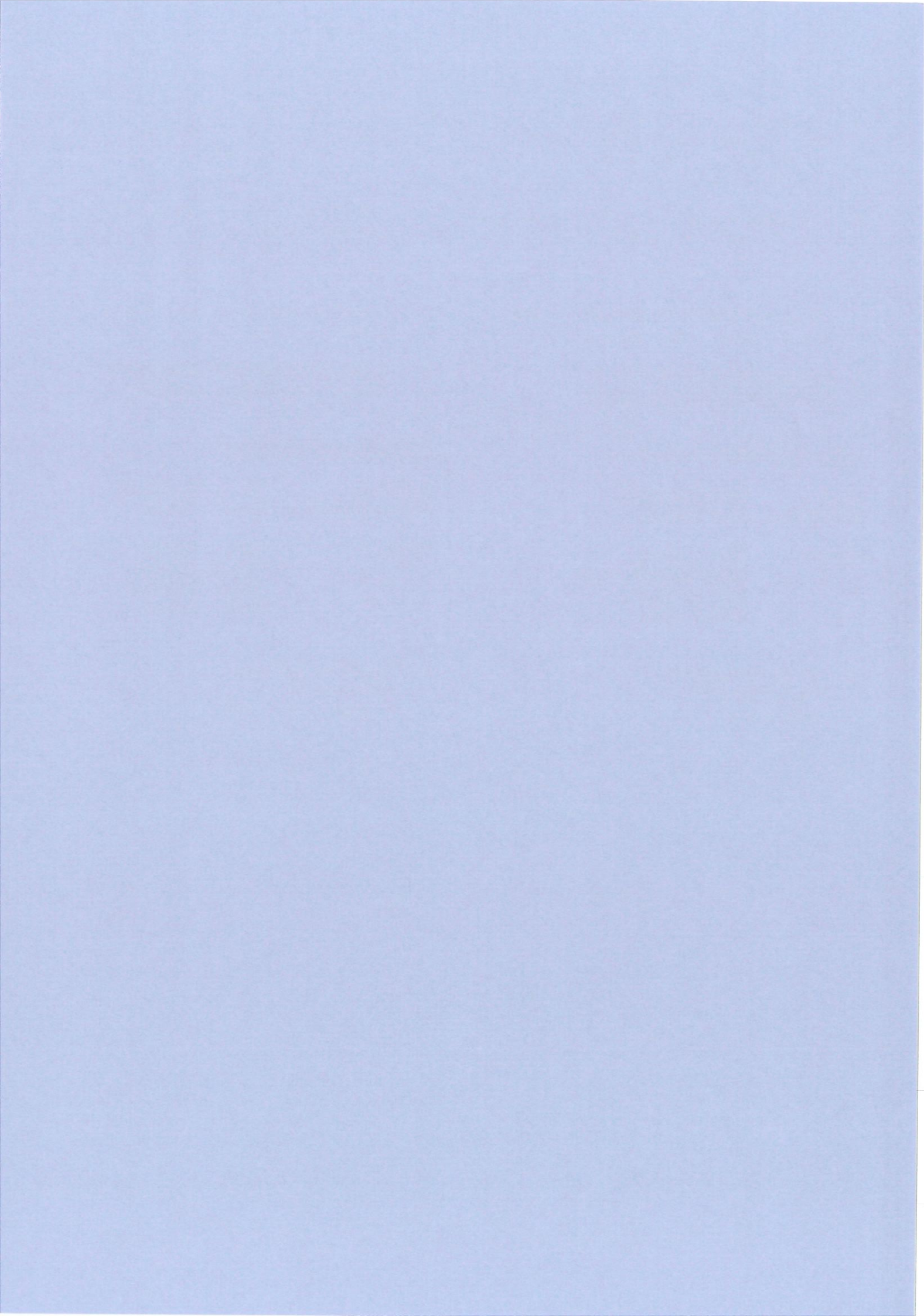

Prestatyn Town Council had been an unofficial litter picking hub as members of the public were able to take the litter picking equipment from the Prestatyn Town Council office and record their findings.

Keep Wales Tidy had approached Prestatyn Town Council in 2025 in order to become a litter picking hub, as it is a prime location in Prestatyn for schools, groups, and other members of the public to easily access the equipment.

19 March 2026 was met with a great turn out. Ysgol Bodnant Eco Council of 10 pupils was at the inauguration, as well as Environmentally Prestatyn, and individuals who regularly litter pick. Ysgol Penforma's Eco Group were also present, and litter picked throughout Prestatyn after the launch. Ysgol Melyd was very interested in attending, however were unable to be there due to transportation. Yet, PTC is arranging another date for the Ysgol Melyd to do a litter pick on the Dyserth – Prestatyn walkway after Easter half term with Meliden's Councillors.

Overall, 9 red bags were collected from the litter pick during the launch and was collected by Denbighshire County Council. Furthermore, there has been interest of Meliden in becoming a litter pick hub from this event.

Event

Prestatyn Town Council initiated Mindfulness Evenings for people that have finish work in Prestatyn and to come to Prestatyn Town Council and find relaxation through low pressure activities. Local research was conducted for activities to do after 17:00, and there were only a handful of groups that were operating that offered physical movement. Mindfulness Evenings was initiated to encourage individuals to try a new physical activity and find healthy ways to spend one's time after work.

PTC reached out to Hong who is a local and Tai Chi instructor. PTC advised Hong to show movements that are easy for relative beginners and give instruction on why each movement was so important. In both classes, all have been fully booked and have been given positive feedback. Furthermore, due to the popularity of Tai Chi, perhaps moving these session to a larger space would be ideal, as Chambers did not offer enough room for 20 individuals. Moreover, other individuals have expressed that they were willing to partake in other activities such as yoga, or Qigong (Tai Chi taking place outside). Please see below for feedback:

I enjoyed last night's Tai Chi session very much. Hong is an excellent teacher even when there is a wide age and ability range in attendance. I would attend future events maybe even Yoga which I've never tried! Hong does Yoga as well.

It was different and interesting to try. My friend enjoyed trying tai chi and my sister enjoyed it.

It was good to move my body after a long day of work! Will be doing this more regularly at home.

Proposal: To continue Mindfulness Evenings in allotted times of the year, at least twice a month with different activities. This will be charged against, Community Wellbeing (4730).

Event

Tenovus representative Deb Critchley reached out to Prestatyn Town Council of December 2025 and asked if they could deliver a presentation about their services to the staff of Prestatyn Town Council. However, Sadie Clarke had an idea of opening this presentation to the public. This came the idea of having a series called 'Chamber's Chats', which would involve any organisation that wants to come in and speak to either staff or public.

Prior to the event, the event was posted on all Prestatyn Town Council social media and traditional media by creating a new 'What's on in Prestatyn and Meliden' leaflet that was distributed around the Prestatyn and Meliden area.

The event was a success as the 6 individuals who were not familiar to Tenovus' services, have reached out to Tenovus for volunteering opportunities, for their will writing services, and for this presentation to be presented in Festival Church. However, from last coffee morning event for Valentines, it should be noted that to gain more reach within the community it should be hosted in conjunction with another coffee morning such as Nant Hall Church, or perhaps reach out to Nant y Mor to host, or even ask a local café as their footfall would garner more attention to the services of the organisation.

The Prestatyn Town Council x Prestatyn Library: St. David's Day Exhibition was initially set up for a week of festivities in honour of St. David's Day. This week consisted of an itinerary that celebrated Welsh culture, and highlighted Prestatyn's history. However, due to funding falling through from the Pilot Scheme: St. David's Day from the Welsh Government. These ideas are available to request.

Prestatyn Town Council approached Prestatyn Library in December for availability of the space at the entrance to showcase local Welsh artists and their interpretation of Prestatyn. Research was conducted for local artists to display their works, and four artists responded. PTC then coordinated with Prestatyn Library when the artists could hand over the artwork for installation.

The exhibition was from 23 February to 23 March to coincide with St. David's Day. Due to Prestatyn Library's limited opening hours, the exhibition lasted for one month for the public to enjoy. From this exhibition, there has been a sale of one of the artworks that has been displayed. Furthermore, an artist has visited Prestatyn Town Council to give their details for future exhibitions. From this the feedback, PTC intends to hold another exhibition in the Library with the intention of more artists participating and displaying their work.

Prestatyn Library has since given their feedback from the success of this exhibition.

'The exhibition was well received by visitors, and it was lovely to have the artwork displayed within the library space.

It added a nice visual element and was appreciated by those who saw it.

From our side, we were pleased to be able to accommodate the display by providing an area within the library.

However, the limited space, the curved wall and the proximity to foot traffic proved less suitable for the delicate nature of the pieces.

We were glad to support PTC and the exhibition on this occasion and thank you again for including us!'

'We found the exhibition to be a really valuable experience. It was a great way to connect with local artists, provide a platform for their work, and encourage meaningful discussion about the local area and its beauty. It also helped bring new energy into the library space and engage a wider audience. At the same time, the exhibition brought its own challenges, particularly in mounting and displaying the

work to a high standard. Ensuring each artist's individual requirements were met was also a new challenge for us.'

The final invoices will be submitted in April 2026 and the final report for Warm Hubs from December to March 2026 will be available and sent to all Councillors by end of April 2026.

During February to March 2026 there have been 764 people that have attended the Warm Hubs sessions in our three sites of Deva Church (Tuesday), Jubilee Community Centre (Wednesdays), and Meliden Community Centre (Fridays). In those sessions, 17 sessions were attended by organisations that have supported the community by advertising their organisations services. Warm Wales have commented that they have been in contact with 17 individuals from the sessions they attended. They further commented that engagement was significantly higher than the past Warm Hubs. Furthermore, most organisations that have attended these sessions have showed interest in visiting the Warm Hubs in November.

Future events: 2026/27

8 April 2026: Easter High Street Hunt. This will start at Prestatyn Town Council, and children need to find images of animals in front of shop windows, as well as going into the shop and collecting stamps from the businesses. The Easter Bunny will make an appearance, and show the children clues to which stores had images in their shop window. The children will finish off by coming back to PTC and collecting a bag of mini eggs. If the children find a chick inside their bag, they will be awarded a bigger Easter egg. Report to be sent at the end of April 2026.

9 April 2026: Coffee and Cake with KIM Inspire. KIM Inspire to hold their coffee and cake with PTC that involves musical bingo, and sweet bags full of chocolate. Children are invited and will be given colouring sheets.

17 April 2026: Roots of Bastion. Local school's eco club have been invited and other groups within Prestatyn to help plant whips in Bastion fields along the fencing of Prestatyn Football Club. These plants have come free from One Voice Wales by applying for one of their Biodiversity Packages.

15 May 2026: Dementia Awareness Event. To be held at Deva Church, and to ask residential homes to invite residents to remember their childhoods with Book of You.

25 May 2026: Welsh Spring Market. To be held at the precinct in Prestatyn High St. This will involve local Welsh artisans, and storyteller to attract people. This is in conjunction with May Half term.

Subject: Local Regeneration Fund

Background

Councillor Ian Lifford and myself are Prestatyn Town Council's representatives on the Prestatyn Liaison Group for the above initiative. Following are notes from a Microsoft Teams meeting held on Friday 20th March 2026

Project Progress

- In general progress against milestones going well. The situation in Iran and the middle east may affect costs but there are no indications as yet
- The MOU is now signed and formal
- The Morfas - essential land acquisition is now complete and 30 acres of the wetland are now in DCC's ownership. The next phase will be a planning application
- Garry Davies, DCC's Countryside Services Officer reported that he continues to work closely with Network Rail and their project to install a new pedestrian bridge will have no impact on LRF's programme
- Consultation with NRW is ongoing regarding flood risk permit and feedback and decision is still awaited.
- There will be 3 options re a pathway and the costs of any of the 3 options will be within budget.
- No protected species have been recorded on the designated pathway location however it is known that water voles are in the vicinity

- DCC will take on the clearance of some culverts which will improve water flow
- Project is on target for delivery and costs
- High Street - The traffic trial for Bridge Road will commence on 13th April 2026 and a road closure will be in effect from 11/4/26 - 13/4/26 to allow preparation
- Camera technology will determine how successful this trial will be
- Detail design will be submitted for consultation in June 2026 to include the results of the Bridge Road traffic trial
- Andy Clarke, DCC Officer presented the prospect of the installation of a Pulse Hub
- These digital hubs are provided at no cost to local authorities and are part of a town's streetscape
- The hubs are a great way to provide information about the town including its history, events, civic communication and advertising

- The team had managed to lay hands on an old phone box which is in need of TLC, but this could be installed in the High Street and used for floral exhibition or book exchange
- Andy Clarke was thanked for releasing early funding for the High Street floral displays especially with the town being in Wales and Britain in Bloom this year
